The Tehama County Flood Control and Water Conservation District developed a governance proposal which includes an eleven member Groundwater Commission comprised of city and water district representatives as well as local stakeholders. The Commission will have both decision-making and advisory responsibilities pertaining to groundwater management in the eleven subbasins or portions thereof for which the District has been designated as the Groundwater Sustainability Agency under the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act of 2014. Agencies representing larger groundwater pumpers (City of Corning, City of Red Bluff, City of Tehama, El Camino Irrigation District, Los Molinos Community Services District, and Rio Alto Water District) in Tehama County will have an established seat on the Commission. The additional five members will represent each of the County Supervisorial Districts, and should be a resident, property owner, or groundwater user within said district. No two members should be officers, employees, or agents of the same agency, district, or public or private corporation.
