AB3030 TECHNICAL ADVISORY GROUP  
JUNE 18, 2001 MEETING**

1. Call to Order: Serge Birk called the meeting to order at 2:03 p.m.
2. None
3. Minutes of May 21, 2001: Motion by Roger Sherrill and second by Kevin Borrer to accept the minutes with the correction of spelling of AOrange Coast Irrigation@ to "Orange Cove@. Carried 6-0 with 3 absent.
4. Public Comment: None
5. Review of Public Outreach: Chairman Birk discussed how the TAC could interface with other groups to inform them of TAC activities. With CalFed moving into the fifth year, many people need the information and it would be of value to network.

Ernie Ohlin added that during activities with various agencies throughout the County the AB3030 Groundwater Management Plan is always discussed. Also, Allen Fulton distributes his newsletter to four County-s for outreach. Meetings are attended to update staff on CalFed activities weekly.

No vote was taken. It was the consensus of those present to inform the above regarding TAC meetings. Staff will bring back the list of contacts for the TAC to approve.

6. Staff Report: Ernie Ohlin distributed a list of applicants for the AB303 Grant. Of the first 24 applicants selected, Tehama County was included. This grant will be used for a Water Inventory and Analysis for Tehama County to document surface and groundwater existing uses and demands.

(b) Staff requested a subcommittee be established to review the report from Butte County which is similar to what Tehama County requested. This can be used as a guide for our grant.

Incorporation of our well log information will also be used. Working toward the RFP ahead of schedule would help move the process along.

Serge Birk, Roger Sherrill and Bill Richardson agreed to review information with a working meeting during the next AB3030.

No voting action was taken on this item. Consensus to form sub-group of these people.

(c) Ernie Ohlin attended a Reeds Creek Watershed Group meeting and discussed with them the AB3030 Groundwater Management Plan and well monitoring.

Well monitoring will take place in July and August. Information will be given to the AB3030 TAC members showing grid and measurement for the past three years.

Bill Richardson requested Spring information be included.

Calfed Appropriate Measurement, part of the Record of Decision (ROD), is proposing Calfed agencies working with the California State Legislature develop legislation for introduction and enactment in 2003 Legislation session requiring the appropriate measurement for all water uses in the State of California. This process has started. Calfed is now into the technical part with regard to what kind of devices to put on what ever or where ever you discharge or pump water. Staff has spoken before committees and questioned if Calfed is talking about the small 10 acre landowner to the 1000 acre landowner and/or cities. An independent review panel has already been selected. Staff will stay involved in the process and update the TAC.

With regard to Sites Reservoir, Lester Snow has been hired as a Project Manager. Staff and Bill Borrer are attending a meeting next week.

Woodson Bridge is still an ongoing process. Staff has sent correspondence to Congressman Doug Ose, Dianne Feinstein and Senator Barbara Boxer in support of money from the Corps of Engineers.

## 7. Sub Committee Report

- 1.1 Well Monitoring - Update: Bill Richardson has reviewed all well logs which will give us a groundwater inventory by sub basin. With the assistance of DWR, more valuable information will document how much water is being extracted, going in, depths, perforation and aquifers.
