AB3030 TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

JULY 17, 2006

Present: Bill Richardson; Mark Barthel; Steve Kimbrough. Also present: Ernie Ohlin, Water Resources Manager; Bill Ehorn, DWR.

1. There was no quorum.

Discussions:

Del-Web discussions on monitoring well. Three triple-completion monitoring wells, test holes at 1200 ft. Water quality testing will be done.

Distribution of information on La BARRANCA Unit: Staff met with USF&WLS. Donation of wells south of Red Bluff (north of Gerber) along the Sacramento River. Information will be forwarded to DWR with previous owners name. Identification needed for best well to be included in monitoring system.

Staff met with representatives of CH₂M Hill regarding the Integrated Water Management Program (IWMP). Draft in process of the regional IWMP and the next steps. Information from the draft will be provided to TAC at the next meeting that pertain to our County. Staff requested projected growth of City of Red Bluff and Corning.

5. Morgan Ranch Development: Handout distributed. This development is next to the Del-Web project along I-5. 3950 Units proposed. To date, things completed on site: drilling of pilot hole, use of observation and production well. Screened between 200 and 500 ft., 3-day pump test at 3000 gallons per minute. Del-Web has pumped approximately 1200 gallons per minute.

Staff discussed expanding modeling completed for the Del-Web project to include data of the area of influence this project may have. Approximately 6000 homes on the west side, in general between these two developments are planned, and per Roger Sherrill, with the current zoning at Lake California, there is the ability to add 8000 lots. With other developments, Sunset Hills included, approximately 20,000 new homes are planned for the area.

6. Sun City Tehama Update: Distribution of revised Water Supply Assessment (without attachments). Current status: original EIR out for comment; many comments received; revised EIR will be completed due to comments received. Staff comments were: a Monitoring Plan to address issues such as monitoring wells, updates on modeling efforts, and dispute resolution. Staff will return this item to the TAC when the first draft of the Monitoring Plan is received.
7. GPS Land Subsidence Monitoring Network: Distribution of correspondence from DWR. DWR is planning to establish a Global Positioning System (GPS) land subsidence monitoring network. Staff is assisting with information in Tehama County, and requesting the monitoring expand more into the County.

8. SB1938 and BMO (Trigger Level) update: Two consultants, Bob Vince and John Ayres have left CDM, leaving us with no one knowledgeable (at CDM) with regard to our project. CDM has decided to sub-contract with Brown-Caldwell, where John Ayres is, and he will continue to work through CDM, on the project. With the remainder of funding, John Ayres will complete: the Bowman area units, recommending certain wells for monitoring; spring contours; and a technical memorandum which will address SB 1938 Compliance. John Ayres will attend the Flood Control meeting of August and update the Board.
