TEHAMA COUNTY AB3030 TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE  
MEETING OF APRIL 16, 2007

No Quorum. Informational Only. This meeting was held in the field and no taping of the meeting was completed.

Present: Allan Fulton; Bob Steinacher; Bill Richardson; Roger Sherrill. Also present: Ernie Ohlin, Water Resources Manager; Dan McManus and Bill Ehorn of DWR; and Lester Messina of Glenn County.

1. CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 2:05 pm by Vice Chairman Allan Fulton. There was no quorum.
2. INTRODUCTIONS: As above.
3. MINUTES
4. MULTI-PARTY WATER RESOURCES MOU: Ernie Ohlin discussed the revised MOU and distributed to those present. The document discusses water districts and other water purveyors sharing data for information throughout the Northern California area. A meeting was attended by Staff for the 4-county representatives. Discussions continued regarding the role NCWA will play. NCWA would be only an administrative manager to send out information. No other role would be taken by NCWA. If NCWA was asked, they could take on technical or funding rolls if all agree. With the "generic" MOU, attachments will come later. Part of the process includes the Sacramento IWRPM information and defining rolls. When questioned how much work will include the Tuscan and NHI, Ernie answered he believed the need to identify projects and funnel through this process was important. Use of websites and any other means of getting information to other counties regarding projects in their area.

The document, Ernie continued, is not binding and any county may back out. GCID has agreed to this re-write.

5. OVERVIEW OF NEW MULTI-COMPLETION GROUNDWATER MONITORING WELL: All present were provided information and samples of the well visited at Capay and Hall Road.

Lester Messina also discussed wells close to the Tehama County line that Glenn County is working on.

It is the hope of Staff that water wells and hydrographs will be added to our website and information provided regarding production wells and the affect when in operation.

Bill Ehorn presented his samples taken every 10' in the 1,000 ft. well. These are logged

and an electric clock will then be run to determine design and levels. Results will determine where the aquifer is. This well will include "five wells" in one hole. Charts of progress were displayed, along with several drilling samples. The Tuscan aquifer is possibly at the 370' level and may be reached by the 800 to 840' level.
